WHAT DOES BUCKEYE STATE CREDIT UNION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and Employment information
- Account balances and Overdraft history
- Credit scores and Payment history

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this **notice**.

How?

All financial companies need to share members personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their members personal information; the reasons Buckeye State Credit Union chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Reasons we can share your personal information	Does Buckeye State Credit Union share?	Can you limit this sharing?
For our everyday business purposes -- such as to process your transactions, maintain your account(s), respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus	Yes	No
For our marketing purposes -- to offer our products and services to you	Yes	Yes
For joint marketing with other financial companies	Yes	No
For our affiliates' everyday business purposes -- information about your transactions and experiences	No	We don't share
For our affiliates' everyday business purposes -- information about your creditworthiness	No	We don't share
For nonaffiliates to market to you	No	We don't share

How does Buckeye State Credit Union protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> sharing for our affiliates' everyday business purposes -- information about your creditworthiness <input type="checkbox"/> affiliates from using your information to market to you <input type="checkbox"/> sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

Definitions

Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Buckeye State Credit Union has no affiliates
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Buckeye State Credit Union does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you
Joint Marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Our joint marketing partner include insurance companies
